Crisis Management Planning Course delivered to Royal Oman Police for senior officers to develop their approach to planning and control of critical incidents.

Criminal Investigation Analysis of the major crime, intelligence and scientific support services for a national police service.

Strategic Review of the Royal St. Lucia Police Force by a team of experienced consultants, providing a detailed report to the Government, followed by a complete programme of training and development, in partnership with the RSLPF.

Media Awareness and Communication Creation of the Press Office and training of Press Officers for the Palestinian Police and Government Security Services.

TV Interview and Technique Training. Media mentoring for senior British police officers and Government officials.

Devolution of Finance and budgeting for the Jamaica Constabulary Force (JCF) so that Divisional Commanders have the skills and confidence to direct finance to their immediate policing needs.

Community Based Policing. A key component of a major public safety and security project for the Kosovo police and community.

Vetting. The design and development of a vetting system for government employees in the Middle East.

Fleet Management Study and reorganisation of a vehicle fleet, management, maintenance facilities and fuel usage for a police force with over 1,500 vehicles.

Successful JCF Reform Nears Completion

Now nearing completion of its current phase, this exciting programme aims to help the JCF reduce its isolation from the community. By improving confidence and support for JCF's work through the introduction of a more community-based policing style, the project involves better local intelligence activities, crime detection, improved management and training skills.

Access to justice, security and the right to live without fear is important for poor people living in deprived communities in Jamaica. Violence and civil unrest are not uncommon and are a key factor in social and economic degeneration in poorer communities. If these high levels of crime can be

reduced, social and economic development can improve, which should in turn benefit the Jamaican economy and thereby the quality of life for the wider population.

JCRMP complements the ongoing justice sector reforms in Jamaica. Initially police-wide, the project is now under the JCF and is making progress despite the high levels of violence and drug-related murders. Linking with other initiatives, an important new development is the creation of a Professional standards Bureau, with particular reference to Anti-Corruption. Focused on the JCF it is hoped that success in this area will bring wider benefits to the Jamaican people.

Belize Police Get Skills Injection From Capital Eye

A strategic review concluded that a new policing style, strategy and organisational structure were required for the Belize Police Department (BPD). Over two years, advice and assistance was provided by Capital Eye's highly experienced former Scotland Yard professionals, to enable and facilitate a significant change programme and help deliver open and accountable services to all its communities. Improvements were made across the range of police operations and administration through carefully targeted assistance to senior management, human resources, training, and finance specialists.

Jointly developed community-based policing initiatives; improving police-community consultations and media communications and relations. Targeting many of the most remote elements of the BPD and involving the community in the Project helped ensure wide acceptance and broad reach for the police.

Access to Safety Security and Justice in Nigeria

Now beyond the inception phase and into its implementation, this Project has significant involvement by Capital Eye staff and is a seven year programme aimed at improving access to justice and the right to live free of violence to self or property. Originally targeted at four DFID focal states as well as working at the Federal level with the Nigerian Police, it has developed into a broader Project so that states with large concentrations of people; large numbers of poor people; and states where a multiplier effect from engagement can be achieved.





Improved Respect For Police in St Lucia Communities

Considerable improvements were realised with the Royal St. Lucia Police Development Project (RSLPF) across their investigation, community policing, financial systems and other specialist operations. Together with a more open approach to community consultation, the project has assisted the RSLPF in its goals of restoring public confidence and improving the policing service provided of the people of St. Lucia, particularly the poorer sections of society. The principal aims of the community-based policing approach were:

Geographically based/**high visibility patrolling** (the same officers remaining in a clearly defined geographical area over a significant period of time and having ongoing regular personal contact with the local public).

People getting to know their local police offices, supervisors and the local Police Chief in their community to **build confidence** and trust.

Officers having more authority to take the initiative and make decisions, being assessed on their ability to gain results in their local community.

Officers learning and acquiring invaluable knowledge of the local environment, social issues and culture of the people they serve whilst also gaining invaluable **community information/intelligence** for more effective policing.

Allowing the opportunity to maximise use/visibility of police resources by deploying police where most needed, setting up of small community offices and/or conducting police surgeries in those locations where there is a **public need for a police presence**.

Providing good management information, enabling police to solve problems more effectively, and allowing their Supervisors and the local Police Commander to be held accountable for police performance.

Applying **intelligence led policing** by the use of properly obtained and assessed "intelligence" that drives all proactive police operations.

Working in partnership with other agencies (local communities, criminal justice agencies, statutory and voluntary organisations, businesses, churches and groups that are engaged with the police and each other in creating "safer and more secure" communities).

Sharing of information between partners to allow effective responses to common problems, e.g. hospitals to share information regarding assaults (to address domestic violence, child abuse, shootings, etc).

Capital Eye Brings Justice to the Balkans

Following a three month scoping study, a Programme involving a wide range of **conflict prevention** measures and justice reforms, including the police, courts and prisons, was set up and continues in parts of Croatia, Bosnia, Kosovo, Albania, Montenegro and Serbia. The long-term goal of the SSAJP is a safe and just society for all in the Balkans, with laws and practices that meet European standards. The medium-term goal is for functioning justice systems, reducing the sources of conflict in the region. The Programme aims to ensure that public bodies implement justice strategies, effectively **reducing local tension**, conflict and crime. Three key outputs have been identified:

Affordable policies which link all parts of the justice system and effectively address the needs of its users.

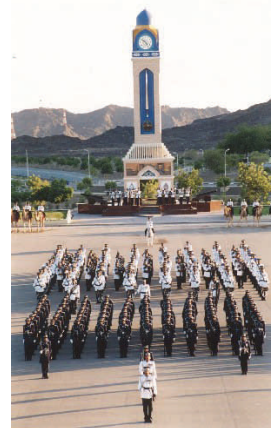
Successful implementation in selected local areas of community based justice, policing and crime prevention strategies.

Mechanisms that enable lesson learning on **justice sector reform** across the region.

CCTV Controls Caribbean Ports & Airports

A government asked Capital Eye to investigate and assess the security arrangements for its ports and airports. The trigger was the new International Ship and Port Authority Security Code (ISPS Code), which requires for example, each port to have the ability to monitor the access to the ships in port, monitor the port perimeter, berthing and anchoring areas. The client placed particular emphasis on CCTV.

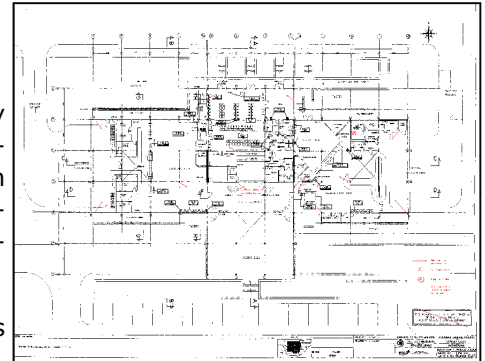
Following the completion of in-depth surveys, detailed specifications were drawn up, fencing and ID card/photo-badging system installed, with the potential to upgrade to an access control system. X-ray scanners and metal detector arches are installed. It is pleasing to be able to design systems to compliment the existing security measures.

We managed the commercial competition for the systems, and are supervising the installation and operation with day and night formal witness testing.

With CCTV maintenance is a problem. Maintenance is part of our Contract. For us proof of maintenance by a competent person is mandatory. We also included recommendations for a list for spares and safe storage.

Included in the specification, was training for operators and managers in the operational use of equipment and procedures and practices.

This project, managed by Capital Eye from conception to full operation, represents a major undertaking by the client government. It is essential to the safety and security of its borders and the continuation of it's trade, particularly with the USA.



Safe Beaches for Island's VIP's



A 5 Star resort hotel, famous as much for its VIP and celebrity clientele as for its location, invited Capital Eye to undertake a full security review for its accommodation and facilities, including children's centre, sports area, golf course and beach. As the hotel guests included politicians at the highest level and prominent international businessmen, evaluating the risks was essential. Capital Eye's experts examined the threats posed by terrorists, organised criminals, petty and opportunist criminals and listed all the other potential problems associated with hotels and leisure complexes.
